

## THOUGHT FOR 4th Sunday of LENT (26/27th March): No matter

how far we may wander away, God never abandons us. We may turn our back on him, but he constantly calls us back to eat the food of his table. Our celebration of Eucharist asks pardon for our wanderings



and gives us a place at God's table. We pray that by eating and drinking the food of life we may be kept in the household of God's love.



1st Reading: (Josh 5:9-12). The Israelites, free at last from the humiliation they suffered in Egypt, enter the land of promise and partake of the produce.

Gospel: (Lk 15:1-3,11-32). The parable of the prodigal son shows that God delights in showing mercy to repentant sinners.

**THOUGHT FOR 5th Sunday of LENT (2nd/3rd April):** The best form of defence is attack. Psychologists tell us that when we feel a particular disgust for something or someone it is because deep down we know we are capable of doing or being the same. Certainly those who

wanted to condemn the woman taken in adultery were not blameless themselves. If we expect forgiveness ourselves then we cannot sit in judgement on others.



1 1st Reading: (Is 43:16-31). Isaiah assures the Jews exiled in Babylon that there will be a new Exodus. This message of hope should inspire us also.

2nd Reading: (Phil 3:8-14). Paul has willingly sacrificed everything for the privilege of knowing Christ. He is still running the race of salvation.

Gospel: (Jn 8:1-11). Jesus refuses to condemn a woman caught in adultery.
