

THOUGHT FOR 2nd Sunday of EASTER (23rd/24th April): We were

born too late to witness the historical resurrection of Jesus. But if, like Thomas, we need some sign that Jesus is really risen, then we simply need to open our eyes. We see the wounds of Jesus in the faces of those who turn to us for help, in those who are in need. And we look upon the glory of Christ wherever there is growth, progress, openness and reconciliation.





□ 1st Reading: (Acts 5:12-16). We hear of the high regard in which the apostles were held by the ordinary people, and of the cures they worked for the sick.

2nd Reading: (Rev 1:9f). John is bidden to write a message - one which has meaning for the Church until the end of time.

Gospel: (Jn 20:19-31). By seeing and touching the wounds of the Risen Lord, Thomas the doubter is cured of his unbelief.





THOUGHT FOR 3rd Sunday of EASTER (30th April/1st May): Jesus continues to



amaze the disciples after his resurrection, yet they do not always recognize him immediately. At our celebration of the Eucharist we too are invited to

enjoy the presence of the risen Lord in his word, in each other and in those who minister. Our faith, like that of the disciples, enables us to recognize him in the breaking of the bread.

1st Reading: (Acts 5:27f). We see the apostles courageously witnessing to the resurrection of Jesus and gladly suffering for it.

2nd Reading: (Rev 5:11-14). We hear a hymn in praise of the crucified and risen Christ.
Gospel: (Jn 21:1-19). This encounter with Jesus is built around Peter.
